We're lucky. At Holy Family Day Home, we get to celebrate Thanksgiving twice each year. We celebrate with family and friends in November; but, we also get to publish **our thanks** each year, too. Annual Reports are about giving thanks to everyone that makes our work possible. The publication of the 2004 Annual Report for Holy Family Day Home is no exception. It has been a wonderful year for us and we have a great deal to be thankful for as we look toward a most exciting future for our children and their families.

First, and foremost, we give thanks for the quality of our program. In November, the Day Home learned that we had become one of only a very small handful of early education programs in the Bay Area to receive

full accreditation by the National Association for the Education of Young Children (NAEYC). A great deal of very, very hard work by our dedicated Board and staff demonstrated for the accreditation team the quality, professionalism and effectiveness of our work with the children and their families. Fewer than 1% of early education providers across the nation ever qualify for such recognition.

Next, we thank the many donors who supported such successful programming by making the Day Home a part of their philanthropy during the past calendar year. No early education center could provide comprehensive and nationally-recognized services to so many families from among the working poor and from the homeless shelter system without significant financial assistance from the Federal, State and Municipal governments, but we are particularly proud that **we match every three dollars provided by public agencies with one dollar donated by individuals, foundations and corporations** — nearly one half million dollars each year! That is a tremendous accomplishment for a small not-for-profit like the Day Home and we could not do it without each and every one of you reaching deep into your hearts and wallets, many of you several times each year.

And, of course, we give thanks each day for our incredible staff. Their commitment to the children is truly a miracle. Inside this Annual Report we share the story of just two of these wonderful individuals, but they represent **the care, love and skill each of our staff bring to the Day Home every day.**

Finally, we give thanks this year that construction of **our new building is moving closer and closer to reality.** Our architects have finalized the drawings. We are now working quietly on several large lead gifts. Once that is complete, we will be asking each of you to step forward once again — this time to secure the future of the Day Home.

Staff Profiles: Meeyoung Kim and Inge Byrnes

One of the great strengths of Holy Family Day Home is our superior staff, some of whom contribute to our successes through their many years of service. Two such individuals are Meeyoung Kim and Inge Byrnes who, together, have dedicated more than twenty-five years to working with our children and their families.



Meeyoung Kim, our Dolores Street Program Site Supervisor, has been part of the Day Home family for ten years. For many of those years, she taught the Spaghetios. Her years in the classroom made her realize just how much a

teacher can change a child's life and how that responsibility makes it necessary for teachers to have skills from many different disciplines.

Meeyoung speaks candidly of her loyalty, stating that she has always felt supported by the Day Home even through some tough personal times in her life. Meeyoung feels that what keeps her at the Day Home is the recognition that every day she is challenged to grow as a person. She also loves working for an organization dedicated to fulfilling her own passion — supporting families in order to provide them a chance for a better life.

In the future, Meeyoung plans to enroll in a Master's Degree program that is comprehensive in nature in that it prepares teachers to utilize skills from a variety of disciplines, including social work and human development, and also incorporates a mentoring component. For teachers to be adequately prepared to deal with the challenges that the modern day family faces, Meeyoung feels this kind of comprehensive training is essential.

This is a philosophy that Meeyoung tries to instill as our Dolores Street Site Supervisor — teachers are at the heart of our program, and they should be supported wholeheartedly by the administration and staff and equipped with the necessary tools to mold our students.



Inge Byrnes, the Head Teacher in our Wizard class, joined the Day Home family almost fifteen years ago on a most historic day. As fate would have it, Inge "missed" her first day at the Day Home because of the Loma Prieta earthquake — an event

that changed the Day Home's history forever.

Since second grade, Inge has felt the calling to be a teacher. After spending several years in elementary schools, she walked through our doors after seeing a job announcement for the Day Home in the newspaper. She hasn't looked back since. In fact, her relationship with the Day Home hits close to her home too — both of her sons have volunteered at the school. One of those sons even suggested the now infamous name for our five year-olds, the "Wizards," and long before Harry Potter!

At the heart of Inge's dedication to the Day Home is her absolute love for the children we serve. At the center of her teaching model is the commitment to, above all else, build up each child's self-confidence and self-esteem. This, Inge believes, will facilitate all types of learning and ultimately prepare each child for the challenges of the big world. Inge received the Child Care Provider Award of Excellence from the San Francisco Child Care Planning and Advisory Council for her pioneering work with special needs children at the Day Home.

Every day in Inge's classroom the Wizards deal with issues such as responsibility, cooperation and conflict resolution, all with the loving guidance of Inge and her team. She works hard to create a sanctuary for the Wizards — a place where they are safe, relaxed and respected for their individuality.

It is impossible to put into words just what Meeyoung and Inge mean to the Day Home. They are an integral part of making the Day Home a leader among early education providers and creating a loving, nurturing environment. More than that, though, teachers like Meeyoung and Inge help define what we mean when we speak of our facility as a "home away from home." We all extend our eternal thanks to both Meeyoung and Inge — their dedication to our children and to their families is inspirational to everyone who knows them, works with them, or learns through their loving care.



Holy Family Day Home Accredited by NAEYC

Holy Family Day Home has earned accreditation from the National Association for the Education of Young Children — the nation’s leading organization of early childhood professionals.

The accreditation places the quality of the Day Home’s program among the top 1% of child care centers in the nation. Moreover, this recognition has been awarded to only fifteen programs in San Francisco.

The Day Home strives to unlock the unique spirit of each child. In today’s environment of ethnic diversity and economic vulnerability, skilled staff at Holy Family Day Home assist every child to develop positive self-esteem, a strong problem-solving capacity and an enduring desire to learn. We partner with parents and guardians to encourage healthier families, build a foundation for lifelong achievement and open doors to a rewarding future through a safe, loving and nurturing environment.

NAEYC created its accreditation program in 1985 to set professional standards for early childhood education, and to help families identify high-quality care and early education programs. To earn NAEYC’s accreditation, a program conducts a comprehensive self-study to determine how well it meets the standards. After necessary improvements are made, the program is observed by independent, professional consultants, and then reviewed by a national panel. Programs are accredited by NAEYC for a five-year period.

Architectural Update: Ready to Go!

On Thursday, February 24, 2005 Holy Family Day Home appeared before the San Francisco Planning Commission in Room 400 at City Hall to request permission to begin construction on our new building. The vote by the Commissioners was unanimous to allow Holy Family Day Home to proceed.

Our architects, CCS Architecture, and our contractor, Frank Portman and Company, are ready to begin work as soon as we have completed “archeological mitigation.” Excavation of our site is particularly important given the historical significance of this location to the Native Peoples of the area as well as to the early Spanish and European settlers in Alta California.

We fulfilled a strict set of guidelines and overcame many regulatory hurdles to reach this point in a very complex process, but now we are ready to begin the significant fundraising required for our new building! Our wonderful Board, the Capital Campaign Leadership Team, and key Staff are now meeting with several individuals and institutions about large lead gifts and major naming opportunities.

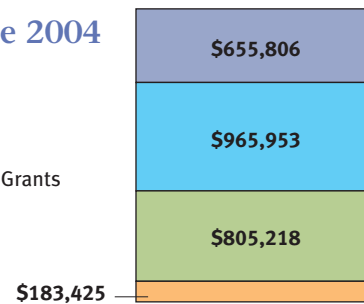

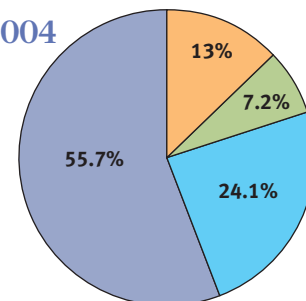
Revenue by Source 2004
