

# 2006 Annual Report

Ron Limoges, our Development Director and primary architect of our \$7.1M Capital Campaign, asked me to write, from my heart and not my head, what our new building at 299 Dolores Street means to me. What I am about to commit here to paper is an attempt to articulate what I have heard, learned, and stored in my heart from all of you who are reading this now.

You, our long-time friends, were privileged to have significantly more years of involvement with this special, holy program than I. And you, our newer friends and partners, by your continued support, provide hope for our children's future. Please forgive me if this fails to paint a complete picture, for I fear that the picture in fact is never, and should never be, completed, or certainly only as long as children need to be educated and loved.

## The Long Version

The new Day Home for our children and families means:

- ▶ That nothing, not even a major earthquake, can separate our children from the care and love (of the Holy Family) that emanates daily from our gentle (not fragile), talented, diverse and very committed staff—our unsung heroes.
- ▶ Hope and stability for at least another 15,000 children, over the next century, who need us the most.
- ▶ Beauty, dignity and early educational parity for those who are marginalized.
- ▶ The fulfillment of a dream for many of the Sisters of the Holy Family, particularly for the current Leadership Team led by Sr. Sharon Flannigan; the first SHF that I met and extraordinary child and Day Home advocate, Sr. Ann Maureen Murphy; and most especially for our dear friend and inspiration, Sr. Marianne Smith.
- ▶ A secured continuation of the legacy which began with our 'soul Sister'—Sr. Dolores Armor—and continued on Dolores Street through the generosity of another 'soul sister' Virginia "Birdie" Fair Vanderbilt—and carried on by so very many who have, over the past 107 years, given their lives (like our dear late Marcella Cashman) in order that children might be able to live with dignity.

- ▶ A beautiful testimony to the sacrifice, unlimited gifts and time, professionalism, care and vigilant supervision of Mr. Robert (Bob) Portman and Mr. Bill Mattade of Frank Portman and Co., our General Contractor.
- ▶ The completion of a special memorial to the care and commitment of Bob's father and our dear alum, the late Mr. Frank Portman, and a reflection of the love that radiates from the love of his life, Mrs. Mary Portman.
- ▶ The result of countless hours of meetings, designs, re-designs, negotiations, debates, walk-throughs, emails, phone calls, agreements, disagreements, requests for information, drawings on napkins, bending over blueprints, waiting in line at the Planning Department, waiting for responses, agonizing over large—and smaller—decisions because 'it's for the children,' reviewing our options, reviewing our decisions, reviewing our revisions, looking at little samples then even bigger samples of—color, tile, carpet, wood, signage, widgets, gadgets and gadgets, by the entire Construction Team consisting of the aforementioned Frank Portman and Co., Cass Calder Smith Architects, namely Lev Weisbach and Tim Quayle, and our Project Manager, Ed Richkind.
- ▶ That we secured the very best sub-contractors known in the construction field today and that many went beyond their contracts and sacrificed their time and resources once they learned the purpose for this special building.
- ▶ That the Board of Directors had the courage, care and commitment to shoulder the direct responsibility for managing the liability of a \$7.1M capital building project so that many future generations of children would be loved and educated as a result of their efforts.
- ▶ That literally thousands of caring people sacrificed and donated their time, talent and resources on behalf of our children and families.
- ▶ That some future Executive Director is guaranteed to wish that something with this construction would have been done differently! (I ask for your pardon now dear peer, in advance, for the lack of vision—for what appears obvious to you is hidden from me now.)
- ▶ That under the brilliant, tireless and loving leadership of the Capital Campaign Committee, co-chaired by Tom Bonomi and Marie Hurabiell, and its members Tom Oertli and Phil Marineau, we all have accomplished what many said could not be done (for they didn't know that heaven was really directing the project).

## The Short Version

In essence and in summary, the new building means simply that God wanted our children to know they were loved.

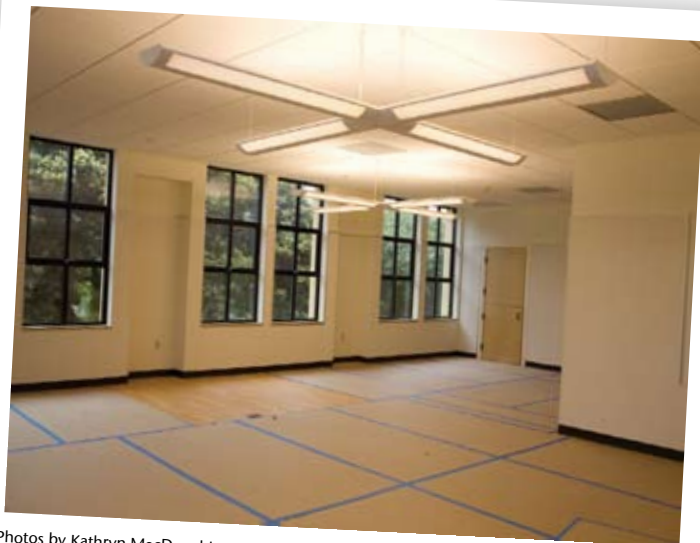

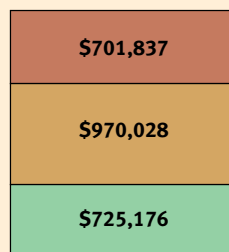

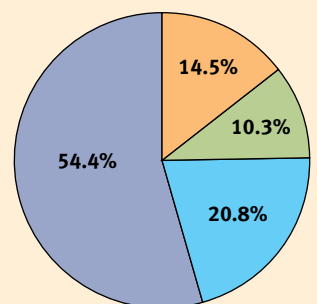
## 2006 Revenue by Source

# WAYS OF GIVING TO HOLY FAMILY DAY HOME

*The Day Home's children and their families thrive because of the generosity of our many donors like you. Thank you.*

*It is your support that allows us to continue to provide affordable, high quality early childhood education to all families regardless of their ability to pay. The Day Home's message is that every child, regardless of background and family income, deserves a loving, nurturing environment that engenders a lifetime love of learning.*

*The Day Home must privately raise one dollar for every three dollars we receive in government support to provide that education. Through annual giving, loyal donors like you rise to the occasion and invest in our "home away from home" and, by extension, in the children entrusted to our care.*

*As our new building rises, we again turn to our many loyal supporters. Now is the time to make a lasting gift*



*to help us provide the best place for young and vulnerable children to learn in San Francisco. Through a gift to our Capital Campaign, you can be a part of building their future.*

*Just as we have many supporters, there are many ways to support the Day Home. Yes, we need cash or stock gifts to help us successfully complete our new building. But an often-overlooked way to support the Day Home is through planned giving. This simply means including the Day Home in your estate plans.*

*This kind of gift provides a significant and lasting impact. Planned giving is essential to the Day Home because it enables us to plan for the future — and that future is our second hundred years of service to some of the most vulnerable children in our community. We ask you to help. We hope you will consider including the Day Home in your estate plans.*

**Giving Through Your Will or Trust:** By far, the most common means of making a charitable gift is through a will or living trust. Such tools, when carefully prepared by your attorney, will allow you to retain full use of your assets during your lifetime and still make a significant contribution to the Day Home.

**Giving Through Gift Annuities:** A charitable gift annuity is a simple contract between you and the Day Home which creates an irrevocable gift. Once that contract is signed, the Day Home agrees to pay the annuitant(s) a fixed dollar amount each year for life. The amount is based on life expectancy; the older you are at the time you make your gift, the greater the payout can be. Such Annuities can be funded with cash or appreciated securities. You receive a significant tax deduction based on your age, the payout rate, and the federal discount rate. This sort of gift can also be made in a deferred format, with payout beginning at some agreed-to date in the future. In either case, at your death the proceeds of the gift annuity becomes available to Holy Family Day Home.

**Giving Through Stocks and Securities:** Charitable gifts of appreciated stocks and securities can provide even greater tax

benefits than a cash gift of equal value. You may take a charitable deduction for the full fair market value of the asset, while avoiding capital gains.

**Giving Through Real Estate:** When you donate a residential or commercial real estate asset to Holy Family Day Home, you may deduct the full fair market value on your federal tax return and avoid the capital gains on the difference between what you paid for the property and its present value.

**Giving Through Charitable Remainder Trusts:** A charitable remainder trust allows you to retain income from your asset for a specific period of time or for the rest of your life. Your funds are held separately and invested for payment of a fixed (or variable) income to you or someone you name. These funds could be a welcome supplement to your retirement income. At the death of each income beneficiary, the remainder of the trust is paid out to Holy Family Day Home. There are many types of charitable trusts. The two best known types are: a unitrust, which provides a flexible rate of return and can have additional gifts added to it; and, an annuity trust, which provides a fixed, guaranteed income but cannot be added to once the initial gift is made.

#### **Giving Through Retirement Plans:**

Retirement plans can provide a convenient way to make a meaningful gift to Holy Family Day Home. If you have established an Individual Retirement Account (IRA), a tax-sheltered annuity, a Keogh Plan or a company retirement or profit-sharing plan that you do not need to draw upon in your retirement, you can earmark these funds for the Day Home, either in your will, or through a trust or direct gift.

**Giving Through Life Insurance:** A life insurance policy provides a unique and surprisingly effective and inexpensive way to support the important work of Holy Family Day Home. You can name the Day Home as primary or secondary (as well as final or remainder) beneficiary. You can assign yearly dividends from the policy to the Day Home. You can donate a paid-up policy that you no longer need, or purchase a new policy naming Holy Family Day Home as the owner/beneficiary. Gifts of Life Insurance entitle you to a tax deduction generally equal to the cash value of the policy at the time of the gift.
